Objectives and Investment Policy

The investment objective of the Sub-Fund is to achieve long term capital appreciation.

To achieve this objective, the Sub-Fund will invest, on a long and short basis, in shares of primarily European companies, but investment may also be made outside Europe. Investment in companies in emerging markets is typically not expected to exceed 10% of the Sub-Fund's net asset value, but apart from this, the Sub-Fund is not restricted to any economic sectors or geographic area.

Any short exposure will be taken through derivatives. Shorting means contracting to sell an asset the Sub-Fund does not yet own in expectation of buying the asset later at a lower price and profiting from an expected fall in value. Derivatives may also be used as a way of investing indirectly in shares, to gain exposure to major equity indices, such as the Eurostoxx 50, DAX and S&P 500 indices, or for hedging purposes.

A derivative is a contract between two or more parties whose value is based on an agreed-upon underlying financial asset or security. The Sub-Fund will primarily use contracts for difference, but may also use futures, options, swaps, credit default swaps, warrants and swaptions.

The Sub-Fund may invest in collective investment schemes ("CIS") and exchange traded funds ("ETFs") that provide exposure consistent with that above.

The Sub-Fund may also invest in cash and money market instruments for cash management purposes.

Under normal market conditions, it is expected that long positions held by the Sub-Fund will represent up to 50% of its net asset value and short positions held by the Sub-Fund will represent up to 50% of its net asset value at any

one time. The Sub-Fund may however hold positions up to 100% of its net asset value long or short at any given time.

You can sell your shares any day that banks are open in Ireland and the United Kingdom. You must submit your application to the Sub-Fund's Administrator before 1.00 p.m. on the business day on which you want to sell.

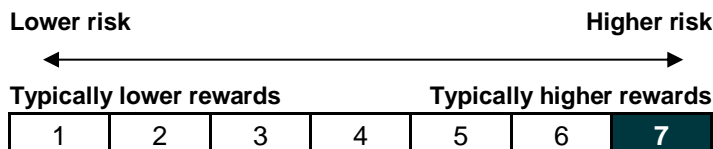
Your shares do not pay you income, but instead the Sub-Fund reinvests any income to grow your capital.

As your shares are denominated in Euro and the Sub-Fund is valued in US Dollars, forward contracts and currency swaps are used by the Sub-Fund with the aim of limiting the effects of changes in the currency exchange rates against the US Dollar.

The Sub-Fund is actively managed, meaning the Investment Manager actively selects and invests the securities in which the Sub-Fund invests with the aim of meeting the investment objective of the Sub-Fund, and is not managed with reference to any benchmark.

Recommendation: the Sub-Fund may not be appropriate for investors who plan to withdraw their money within 5 years.

Risk and Reward Profile



The risk category for this Sub-Fund is set at 7. It is calculated in line with EU regulations and is based on the risk limit for the Sub-Fund.

A **category 1** Sub-Fund is not a risk-free investment - the risk of losing your money is small, but the chance of making gains is also limited. With a **category 7** Sub-Fund, the risk of losing your money is high but there is also a chance of making higher gains. The seven-category scale is complex. For example, a category 2 Sub-Fund is not twice as risky as a category 1 Sub-Fund. The risk category shown is not guaranteed and may change over time.

When categorising the Sub-Fund it may happen that not all material risks were fully captured in the methodology. For a more detailed explanation of risks, please refer to the "Special Considerations and Risk Factors" section of the prospectus.

Short Selling Risk: The Sub-Fund may create synthetic short positions through the use of derivatives. Short positions behave differently from long positions, and the Sub-Fund can for example come under pressure to close out short positions at short notice, and before an offsetting long position can mature. This can create unexpected losses from positions that might

otherwise have been seen as low risk or well hedged.

Leverage Risk: Leverage arises from entering into derivatives whose terms have the effect of magnifying an outcome meaning the profits and losses from investment can be greater than if the investment is made directly into the underlying securities.

Derivatives Risk: The Sub-Fund may use derivative instruments which are not traded on a market and may experience difficulty in selling or closing out a derivatives position if the counterparty is unwilling to agree release the Sub-Fund from its contract at a market price.

Credit and Counterparty Risk: A counterparty may fail in paying the proceeds of sale for assets sold by the Sub-Fund or may fail in delivering securities purchased by the Sub-Fund. Securities which have a lower credit rating are generally considered to have a higher credit risk and a greater possibility of default than more highly rated or investment grade securities.

Charges

The charges you pay are used to pay the costs of running the Sub-Fund, including the costs of marketing and distributing it. These charges reduce the potential growth of your investment.

This means that the holdings of the Sub-Fund are held separately under Irish law from the holdings of the other Sub-Funds of MontLake UCITS Platform ICAV.

You may switch your shares to the shares of another Sub-Fund of MontLake UCITS Platform ICAV free of charge.
