Performance Returns

The Tosca Micro Cap UCITS Fund returned 2.10% in July (GBP Institutional share class).

Investment Objective & Strategy

The Tosca Micro Cap UCITS Fund is a fundamental, value-orientated strategy, applied to the opportunity rich UK micro cap segment. The fund will invest primarily in "micro cap" companies with a market capitalisation of up to £250m that are listed in the UK, and which are or are expected to become constituents of the FTSE Small Cap or the FTSE AIM All Share Index. The Fund is managed by Matt Siebert who, together with Daniel Cane and Jamie Taylor, support Martin Hughes in the management of the Toscafund mid-cap strategy. As such, the Fund represents an extension of the same investment philosophy employed in the award winning Tosca Opportunity and Tosca Mid Cap funds. The Fund targets an annualised return in excess of 15% (net of fees).

Manager Commentary

Are we there yet? Uncertainty is no one's friend other than buyers of the VIX. In such markets investors are naturally cautious and as such decision making takes longer and the availability of capital shrinks. Such environments do cause us to challenge our prior analysis and constantly engage with management. With the rates cycle accelerating, it does feel that inflation is belatedly being checked, and as such, a step in the right direction. Markets as a result moved higher in the month which was very welcome.

Over the course of the last 3-6 months we have evolved our thinking on a number of themes. Inflation will be higher for longer, Government's involvement in the wider economy will increase further and that the need to drive efficiencies through all areas of the economy to help support GDP as well as pay for health, defense etc... is becoming ever more critical. With this in mind we have increased weightings in oil and gas, healthcare services and Government outsourcing while reducing exposure to UK consumer, inventory risk and balance sheet leverage.

The biggest position in the fund is Kistos (+1.7%). This is a UK listed gas producer with assets in both the Dutch and UK North Sea. As the world knows, gas prices have remained at or close to multi-year highs. Indeed Dutch gas spot prices have outstripped other equivalents meaning that the company is well placed to generate c75% of its current market cap in FCF this year. Given its favourable cash position, coupled with very supportive tax incentives, the company has launched a bid for Serica. The commercial logic for such a tie up is compelling in our view, where we estimate synergies of up to £200m (15% combined market cap). Whatever happens, the known known is that both businesses are awash with cash and will either look to deploy that swiftly or have to return to shareholders. Either way, this remains an exciting story.

Despite entering so called quiet months of the summer, December yearend companies have been reporting half year trading updates. These, for the most part, have been in line to slightly ahead of expectations. Fonix (+0.4%), the provider of mobile payments and interactive services into radio, tv and charity sectors, was modestly ahead in H1. Furthermore, they signaled further momentum into H2 and FY23 with new client wins and the entry into new markets (e.g. Ireland). Tremor International (+0.4%) shook off negative sentiment surrounding the online advertising market by acquiring a peer, Amobee for c\$240m. To put this into context, this is a business that Singtel had spent north of \$1.5bn in buying and building over a number of years. While no synergy numbers have been released to the market pending an EGM, we estimate that efficiencies should top \$75m within 2 years, or just under 10% of the current market cap. Free cash flow, already in double digits will accelerate further giving options for further buy backs or M&A.

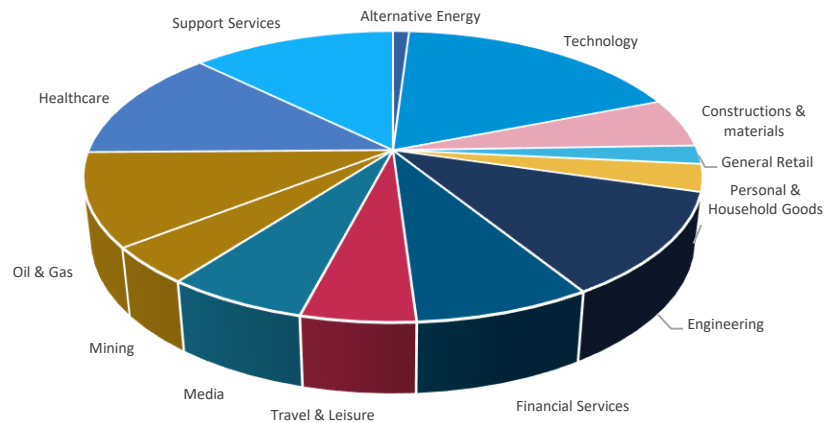

COMPOSITION OF FUND (data as at 31 July 2022)

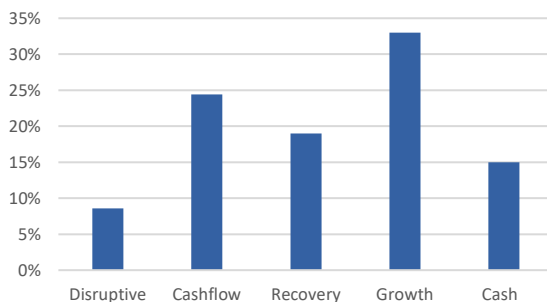
